Who we are - The 2016 United Methodist Book of Discipline charges the General Commission on United Methodist Men with the "primary oversight for the coordination and resourcing of men's ministry with The United Methodist Church." (paragraph 2302)

**Brief history** - By a margin of 80% to 20%, the General Conference of 1996 approved the creation of the General Commission on United Methodist Men (GCUMM), effective January 1, 1997. The GCUMM assumed the responsibilities of the former Division of United Methodist Men of the General Board of Discipleship. A Board of Directors was established by General Conference to oversee the work of the Commission.

**Mission -** To help Men Grow in Christ, So Others May Know Christ.

**Board of Directors** - The GCUMM board of Directors is responsible for communicating through its staff to its affiliates and partners, and the UMC, the mission and vision of the GCUMM to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.

### CHILDREN & YOUTH MINISTRY

Keystone Kid's Church is a place where children aged 4 through 5th grade can go and have fun at church. Children will hear and learn the same message as the grown-ups, but on their level and have fun doing it. In Kid's Church we have fun growing spiritually learning about God's word and how we can live it out at home, play and school.

We use a large group-small group format starting with large group where we have praise and worship time. After large group we break into small groups where we learn more about the message thru crafts, games, and activities. Kid's Church is available during both services.

Our nursery is available for children birth through 3 years old. In the nursery the children will hear God's word through play and Storytime. Nursery is available at both services.

Our youth, 6th through 12th grade, meet for Bible Study where they will hear the same message as their family in the Sanctuary, During Bible Study we are digging deep into the message learning how to use our Bible and how to use God's word in our life at home and school. Youth Bible Study is available in room 12 behind the Sanctuary at the 9:45am service.



### CHILDREN & YOUTH MINISTRY

At the 9:45am service, children will be dropped off and signed in for Kid's Church in room 12 behind the Sanctuary before service and picked up there after church. During the 11:00am service, children will begin the service with their family in the Fellowship Hall where they will sign-in and stay for the first half of Praise time. Afterwards the children will leave together with our awesome children's ministry team and go to the Preschool building for Kid's Church. Parents will pick up their littlest ones (birth through age 3) in room 1 and children 4 and up in room 4 after the service.

Our volunteers are all background checked and attend child protection classes and training.

### **MISSION STATEMENT**

Keystone Christian Preschool (KCP) will provide superior preschool and child care programs for children ages 2 years to 5 years of age, teaching them of God's love in a safe, nurturing environment. Children are encouraged to build on their prior knowledge through exploration and play in a stimulating atmosphere created by well-trained and nurturing teachers, thus cultivating a lifelong love of learning.

### **EDUCATIONAL PHILOSOPHY**

KCP follows the early childhood educational philosophy that our children learn through experiential activities. Young children acquire knowledge by doing, and experiences should be full of movement, imagination, and self-directed play. Children also require a safe, loving, stress-free environment in which to learn and grow. We will provide that security together with an enriched atmosphere that encourages children in making discoveries that build on their prior knowledge. Children will learn of God's love through Bible stories, weekly Chapel time with our Pastor, songs and games.

### **STANDARDS**

Keystone Christian Preschool is licensed by Hillsborough County Child Care Licensing and visited by a representative of that office quarterly. Our license is renewed annually. In addition, we have an annual inspection by the Fire Marshall's Office. Keystone Christian Preschool is also an approved Voluntary Pre-kindergarten (VPK) provider for the State of FL. A VPK Specialist visits KCP yearly to ensure that we are in full compliance with the requirements for this state-funded pre-kindergarten program for eligible four-year olds. With the direct support of our dedicated staff, we meet and continually exceed all requirements set forth by these agencies.



### MISSIONS

The Missions Team explores options for programs for Keystone United Methodist Church to support in the community and internationally based on suggestions and input from Pastor Kathi, the ministry team and others at KUMC. We summarize each program to educate the congregation so they can individually determine which programs they would like to personally support.

### BUTTERFLY STITCHES

Butterfly Stitches is a sewing ministry dedicated to carrying the Light of Christ to families experiencing pain and grief from the death of their preemie or infant child. We make and provide Blessing Gown Sets to the hospital as a way of validating the importance of every life, no matter how tiny or brief. These gifts are given as an act of Christian love and compassion and to point the way to Christ as the one to be trusted to hold their precious child in HIS gentle arms.

For some of the babies, the blessing garments may be the only ones they receive and wear. They are kept by the parents as keepsakes. Others may be used as christening gowns for preemies too small to be dressed in traditional gowns. Both are a blessing to the parents.

The need for these special garments is ongoing. We currently deliver 24 (three-piece sets) every 8 weeks to St. Joseph's Hospital Neonatal Intensive Care Unit.

### FOOD PANTRY

One of the missions sponsored by KUMC is our church food pantry. Bonnie Culbertson opened the Keystone food pantry in the fall of 2008 and has been an integral part of Keystone United Methodist Church outreach. We have provided food assistance to individuals and families in need in our community for 17 years. Food insecurity is a major issue in our area as well as throughout the United States.

The Keystone UMC food pantry provides food items and personal items, which include household items, two days a week, Monday and Thursday, from 1:00-3:00pm in the afternoon. Clients can visit the food pantry every two weeks for food and monthly for personal items. All dates and times are documented for tracking. Getting involved in your local food pantry shows that you are willing to give back to the community and those in need. By volunteering you are helping during all kinds of emergency situations.

We operate by donations and volunteers only; volunteers are always welcome. We consider even a small donation weekly or monthly or a once-a-year monetary donation a blessing. ### LEADERSHIP BOARD & NOMINATIONS TEAM

### NOMINATIONS & LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT TEAM

The task of this team is to identify, develop, deploy, evaluate, and monitor Christian spiritual leadership for the local congregation. They work with the pastor and lay leader to recommend people to serve as officers and leaders of designated ministries of the church for the work of the church. Team members also serve a 3 year term.

### PRESCHOOL BOARD

The preschool board is a group of volunteers who help govern and support our preschool program. They are responsible for setting policies, managing the budget, and ensuring the program meets community needs. Members serve a three year term, so there is always room for new people.
